YOUTH CHALLENGE ELECTED OFFICIALS TO MAKE SMOKE-FREE HOUSING A TOP PRIORITY

WHAT: Youth advocates from the Youth Leadership Institute will hold a press conference to release data findings from surveys that demonstrate community members want smoke-free housing. Youth will be joined by public officials, a property owner, and a health expert to launch a campaign in San Mateo County for local jurisdictions to pass nonsmoking ordinances for multi-unit housing. Youth advocates are asking elected officials in San Mateo County to pass policies that would require multi-unit housing to be non-smoking. Belmont led the charge as the first city in the nation to pass a comprehensive smoke-free housing ordinance in 2007, yet is still the only city in San Mateo County that has adopted this type of policy. Local youth and community leaders know that we can do better!
